**16 July 2019 – Singapore** – Ocean Network Express (ONE) has provided free transportation of 2-containers full of recycled clothing from Yokohama, Japan to Durban, South Africa to aid the cyclone victims in Malawi, Zimbabwe, and Mozambique. The recycled clothing was supplied by UNIQLO, a Japanese casual wear designer, manufacturer and retailer. ONE would like to extend its deepest condolence to those affected by the cyclone.

On 9 July, Mr. Bentley Namasasu of Marawi Embassy and Mr. Taona Havadi of Zimbabwe Embassy participated in the packing operation of the recycled clothing to express their utmost gratitude for the assistance received. The two containers loaded with the clothing will be shipped on NYK DEMETER on 15 July and will arrive in Durban in mid of August. Upon arrival, the relief items will be distributed at the Ubuntu facility in Zimbabwe to the affected areas.

Working closely with Malawi, Zimbabwe and Mozambique embassies, the NPO organization Ubuntu, and Japanese Organization for International Cooperation in Family Planning

(JOICFP), the international cooperation NGO, this joint initiative has further strengthened the relationships between Japan and these countries.
